## Weekend full of success for KISD netters

It was a weekend of success for KISD tennis teams at the Fort Bend Tournament.

Taylor, Cinco Ranch and Seven Lakes went a combined 9-2 in the "A" bracket, while Morton Ranch won its first-ever team title in the "B" bracket.

The Mavericks rolled past Pearlland Dawson 16-2, then needed to rally to squeak past Cy-Fair 10-9 in the quarterfinals on Friday.

Things were a bit easier on Saturday as Morton Ranch beat Foster 13-6 and Lamar Consolidated 14-5.

"The kids are stoked," Mavericks coach Greg Tielke said. "They had a lot of blisters and sunburns on Saturday, but they fought on all day. I'm very proud of them."

It didn't look like the Mavericks would advance in the winner's bracket against Cy-Fair as they trailed 9-5, but Jeremy Grandberry won a key boys match and then Ashley Worthol, Jessica Hardman and Angelie Juaneza completed straight-set victories to tie the contest at 9-9.

That left the match in the hands of junior Chaley Shiffler, who rallied from down a break in the second set to prevail 6-2, 6-4.

"Chaley's really in a comfort zone right now," Tielke

said. "I don't have to worry about her. She and Angelie are hitting the ball great."

Shiffler, Juaneza and Michelle Rhein won all eight matches for the Mavericks. Shiffler and Juaneza did not lose a set in doubles, while Rhein and Jessica Olvera rolled through the competition at line three doubles.

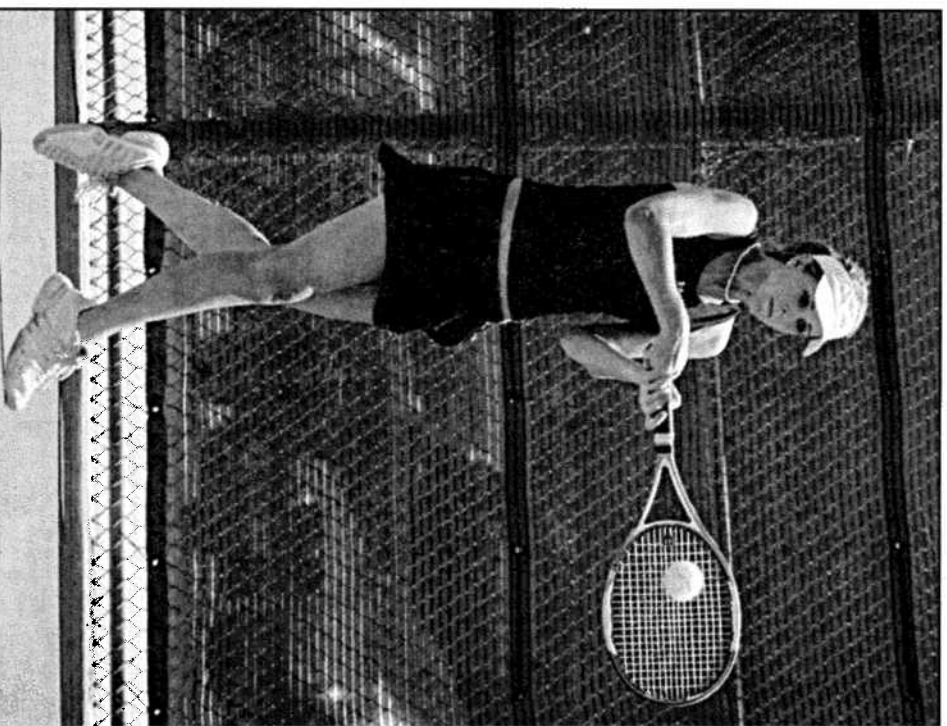
"We're getting better at doubles, but our singles was really looking stout," Tielke said. "(No. 1) John Dickson is stepping up to the plate and (No. 3) Lance (Lanier) was a beast, and the bottom of our lineup is really coming through."

Taylor rolled through its side of the "A" bracket, beating Cypress Falls 16-2, Dulles 12-5 and San Antonio Alamo Heights 13-6.

The Mustangs were set to play Memorial in the finals, but Taylor coach Kirk Kniffen chose to postpone the match so his squad would be fresh for Tuesday's District 17-5A showdown at Cinco Ranch.

Matt Woolley, Igor Cancardo and Crystal Leung were unbeaten for the Mustangs in the three matches, while Kniffen liked the improvement he saw from No. 1 girls doubles team Mia Matuszak and Annat Rabinovich, plus No. 4 Stephanie Williamson and No. 6 Stephanie Yu.

Cinco Ranch also had a strong tournament, fall-

ing only to Memorial in the semifinals.

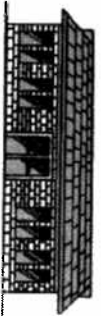
